Best's Great Western 2017 Nursery Block Dry Red

Made from Henry Best's first plantings of nearly 150 years ago, the ancient Nursery Block is a veritable vineyard museum with 39 separate varieties, 8 remaining unknown and unnamed to this day. A lighter bodied wine that explodes with the personality, soil and history of the vineyard site. This wine is made from numerous red varieties including those recorded by Henry Best as Black Prince, Bad Bearer, Rough Leaf, Grand Turk and the underrated Pinot Dru. This wine is not made every year, so we are thrilled when we have the opportunity to record this history in a bottle.

| Colour | Vibrant purple with a garnet hue. |
| Bouquet | Intense aromatics display a large spectrum of fruits with notes of rose petals, tobacco leaf, golden peaches and warm spices. |
| Palate | Light to medium bodied but has a multitude of crunchy and vibrant flavours with a savoury, velvety and moreish finish. A great, easy-drinking red that would pair with a variety of cuisine. Try it slightly chilled (14°C) with Tomato Gazpacho soup. |
| Vintage | Fantastic winter rains set the vineyards up for ideal spring growing conditions that saw great flowering and fruit set. The mild summer conditions and long ripening period (with some timely small rain events) ensured that the fruit matured in near perfect conditions for harvest. A vintage that has more resemblance to those of the 80s and 90s than the vintages of this century. |
