Best's Great Western Cabernet Sauvignon 2010

One of the greatest things about the Great Western wine region is its ability to successfully grow a broad range of grape varieties. Shiraz may be the regional hero, but Cabernet Sauvignon from the area can lay almost equal claim.

Best's 2010 Great Western Cabernet Sauvignon is a fine example of the Great Western Regional style; showing rich, mocha and berry fruit with a solid mid-palate weight thanks to superbly concentrated fruit.

Grape Variety	Cabernet Sauvignon
Alcohol	13%

Tasting Notes:

Colour	Deep red with purple hues.
Bouquet	Lifted varietal characters with hints of dried herbs, violets, cigar box and mocha.
Palate	A classically structured Cabernet, this wine shows rich blackcurrant and berry fruit with some aromatic red berry, dried herbs and briary red fruit characters. Multi-layered and ready to drink now.
Cellaring	Now to 2018
Vintage	2010 was a great growing season and we're seeing some supple, medium bodied Cabernet as a result. An exciting combination of parcels came together to produce a wine with lifted varietal characteristics, ripeness and mid-palate weight but with well developed tannins.
