



TASTING NOTE

2017 BART'S BLOCK SHIRAZ

Bart's Block is a very special parcel of dry grown Shiraz in the Concongella vineyard. Planted in 1966 with Best's Old Block Clone Shiraz and named to commemorate the birth of Hamish "Bart" Thomson in the same year. The soil in this vineyard is made up of quartz and granite gravels that formed part of the old creek bed. The free draining soils and the extensive root systems of the dry grown vines give the resultant wine a finesse and intensity that is unique to this site. This is the first time a single vineyard wine has been made from this block. The fruit from Bart's Block usually forms part of our premium and iconic Bin No. 0 Shiraz.

Tasting Note (Screw Cap)

Colour	Deep red with a ruby/garnet hue.
Bouquet	A rich and inviting nose of pepper, spice, red berries, musk stick, and rose petals.
Palate	Hi-tone vibrant palate of current and red plum. Coupled with apricot skin, back pepper, and spice. This wine has a lovely roundness with soft tannins, and good acidity keeping this wine fresh.

This wine is 6 years old and is in a great place. Still lovely and fresh while tannins are beginning to soften. Very good to drink now and could age gracefully for another 12 years.

Vintage

Fantastic winter rains set the vineyards up for ideal spring growing conditions that saw great flowering and fruit set. The mild summer conditions and long ripening period (with some timely small rain events) ensured that the fruit matured in near perfect conditions for harvest. A vintage that has more resemblance to those of the 80s and 90s than the vintages of this century.

HALLIDAY WINE COMPANION 2020

The vineyard was planted in 66' to be released in 2020 to celebrate the Thomson Family's 100th year history and custodianship of the property and vineyard. Fermented with 25% whole bunches, matured in French oak (20%new). The colour is brilliant crimson, deep but bright. Yes, there's fantastic fruit that's been handled with kid gloves and yes, it's got '17 written all over it with its dazzling red fruits and (almost unseen) acidity to protect its freshness.

THE REAL REVIEW, March 2021

Deep ruby-red colour in the glass. A nose of white pepper, dry earth and blood plums. Medium-bodied but with ample dark fruit power. Layered with pepper, slate and boudin noir complexities that fill the palate until a fine grain of tannins cleans it up. There's a sense of calm here as it lingers forever on the palate. **Rating: 96 points, drink 2021 - 2036**
